- ◆ Therapy for children and adolescents includes problems of mood and behavior including school problems, learning problems, ADHD assessment and treatment, sexual problems and education, substance abuse, out of control, defiant and oppositional behavior and delinquency, cutting, eating disorders, and sexual orientation. Child and adolescent development is an area of expertise.
- ◆ Individual therapy for adults includes problems of mood and behavior, relationships, ADHD assessment and treatment, compulsive sexual behavior, substance abuse, domestic violence, anger management, anxiety, depression and a host of other problems.
- ◆ Couples therapy includes working with dating and premarital couples, domestic partners, GLBT couples, and marital partners. Relationship problems of any type including business relations are an area of expertise.
- ◆ Individual, family and group therapy for adolescents and adults engaged in sexually inappropriate or abusive behavior or charged or convicted of sex crimes. Individual, family and group therapy for sexually reactive children, adolescents and adults. Sexual abuse, addictions, and victims/victimizers are areas of expertise.
